We won't lie: the deep sadness of having to cancel our Visioni 2020 is still with us. We had to do so only 4 days before it started, when everything was prepared to welcome our guests and audience. But we all know that Art and Theatre are ephemeral; they are made of moments that will dissolve in the wind and in time, to then meet again and create new architectures reflecting the uniqueness of the times we are living.

So, from 14 to 20 March, for this third special edition of Visioni, we will continue to go with the flow, building more new editions - maybe limited in terms of days, but not in terms of density and intensity. We want to look at the (fundamentally dystopian) era we are living with determination and optimism, believing that we need to accept the unexpected and live with the unlooked-for.

But we will always find joy in navigating through the big river of our commitment, proud to be among those who do it under the rain and through the fog.

Proud to do theatre for children and to be among those who want to cut the fog that makes childhood invisible to the eyes of adults.

A fog made of wrong assumptions, that can be summed up with the idea that children and young people are, after all, only adults of the future, and not men and women of today.

This is the fog that makes children and teenagers the most invisible beings amongst the many invisible beings of the world.

They are so invisible that they aren't even acknowledged as a minority to fight for, with fundamental rights to be supported.

An unseen, forgotten, invisible minority.

A minority made of other minorities - those that can be found in children aged from 0 to 14, all those human beings who have not yet been adults, without any distinction of genre, skills, ethnic group, social or economic status.

All children and teenagers are part of this invisible minority, even the rich ones, even the skilled ones.

Too often, they are all forgotten or simply not seen or considered as a whole.

They are all considered "too young" or, sometimes "already grown up". A minority that is never fully included, even when it's taken care of, and remains invisible behind the fog made of the indolence and absence of the adults.

It is through that fog that Visioni invites you to wander...



SEMINAR

Performing arts and literature for children: when complex systems interlock

The close relationship between children's literature and performing arts - theatre in particular - is often taken for granted. And just as frequently, many think that picturebooks or literary works can be directly and very easily translated into shows or narrations.

Of course, there are common points, but we need to be able to catch them beyond all stereotypes and banalisations, aware that not all adaptations can automatically become high-quality live shows. The seminar will explore the complexity of children's literature, a large system that includes endless sub-genres - from illustration, prose, poetry, to iconotext, a "third language" establishing a deep, unbreakable bond between text and illustration.

We will spend the morning with scholars and artists, reflecting on the characteristics of the literary and iconic dimensions, listening to the words and thoughts of those who live, work, and experience theatre and performing arts with all their possible interactions every day. To always be able to provide young boys and girls with a high-quality artistic offer, will these two universes follow parallel or interlocking paths?

The webinar "Performing Arts for Early Years in Latin America" is organised in collaboration with the Iberoamerican Network of Performing Arts for Young Audiences (Red IberoAmericana de Artes Escénicas para la Infancia y la Juventud), the network of ASSITEJ national centres in South America.

It is an important event for the Festival, as it is a way to share knowledge and practice at a transnational level.

What do Performing Arts for Early Years in the many Countries of Latin America have in common with the ones practised in other regions of the world? What, if any, are the differences? Do they have a similar aesthetic dimension? What's the impact of the social context on their development?

During the webinar, we will try to give an answer to these questions while investigating other aspects, to strengthen the bond between TYA artists in Latin America and in the world.

We will be offered a deeper insight into the current situation in the many Countries of Latin America, to discover how artists living in those Countries connect with each other and the rest of the world, and to reflect on their future perspectives.

DANCE FOCUS

Focus sulla danza per bambini e ragazzi

Started in 2018, the collaboration between YDN - Young Dance Network, the new-born network working for the development and diffusion of dance for children and young audiences in Italy and around the world, and Small Size Network continues.

This two-day meeting was organised by the Italian YDN working group with the support of Visioni, because we believe it crucial to continue to put special emphasis on dance in all its forms, and to move forward with the development of a network involving dance professionals in both the production and distribution areas. Step by step, towards tangible results. The dance focus will be held on March 13 and 14, with two live meetings for Italian professionals (upon invitation) and an online international session (public).

ZERO/TRE chiama ITALIA

Every year, while organising Visioni, we realise that the offer of shows for very young children is limited to just a few ones, in particular from Italian theatre companies. Judging by the proposals we receive, it seems clear that to produce shows for boys and girls from 0 to 3 is not a priority in the Italian TYA scenario.

It might be for commercial reasons, or for the difficulties encountered in finding "stable allies" at a local level, or maybe it's just because a sceptical view of children as "spectators" is still widespread amongst our Italian colleagues.

This is why we created Zero/Tre chiama Italia, a project aimed at encouraging Italian TYA companies to produce shows for children aged 0 to 3.

So, we contacted a few Italian companies who have never produced for this age group: by offering them a new challenge, they might decide to start their own journey and approach the youngest spectators.

Three companies have accepted our invitation: **Teatro nel Baule** (Naples). **Teatro Koreja** (Lecce) and **Schedía Teatro** (Milan), who will be creating a presentation to bring to Visioni 2022.

In Bologna, the relationship between Theatre and Educational Services is so deeply rooted it is taken for granted, but it might not be the same in the rest of Italy.

So, the companies will be guests of both the Theatre and the Crèches of our city: it will be an opportunity to study, reflect, and find new perspectives, and at the Festival they will be able to exchange, share, and collect ideas, presenting the first steps of their future (possible?) research work.

What lies ahead of these first steps, no one knows, but there's a good chance this opportunity will give life to shows for the little ones.

And if this happened, they will certainly be part of Visioni 2023.

A STORY IS ABOUT TO BE BORN Short, surreal online conversations with children in the creches

In the days before the Festival starts, we will once again meet the children in a multimedia environment, proposing an artistic interaction. This special type of interaction was first launched in 2021 in the framework of the protocol "ZeroThreeSix... Theatre" subscribed by the Education Area of the Municipality of Bologna and La Baracca-Testoni Ragazzi following the Covid restrictions, as a way to keep the relationship between theatre and crèches alive.

Both children and educators welcomed this idea enthusiastically, to the surprise of the artists involved, who could experience first-hand new ways of approaching/interacting with the children.

A story is about to be born 2022 will develop over three meetings, involving two crèches classes assisted by particularly motivated educators, because we believe that dialogue needs an active collaboration and participation.

On **Wednesday**, **March 16 at 19.30**, the project will be shared with the artists and professionals attending Visioni 2022.

ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE GLASS

On the other side of the glass: a new chapter of the project created by La Baracca in collaboration with the Municipality of Bologna, to reintroduce theatre into the educational services while respecting the Covid-19 emergency restrictions.

From March to May 2021, the performances *The elephant and the dancer* and *Fragments of Frames* were presented to as many as 81 classes in the city's crèches and kindergartens.

The performances of On the other side of the glass were presented on the other side of a glass door: surprised, the children inside could decide to either watch what was happening outside or continue with their games and activities.

A piece of artistic research on the children as (aware or unaware) spectators: what do children from 1 to 6 feel and perceive when they are involved in an artistic relationship in a completely unexpected way?

In 2022 we created a new dance performance with elements of clowning: *The bear and the dancer*.

As from March, it will be presented in 10 educational services (crèches and kindergartens).

On **Friday**, **March 18 at 20.00**, the project will be shared with the artists and professionals attending Visioni 2022.

The ZeroThreeSix... THEATRE PROTOCOL

The Festival Visioni di futuro, visioni di teatro is one of the activities promoted and supported by the "ZeroThreeSix... Theatre" Protocol shared by the Education and New Generations Area of the Municipality of Bologna and La Baracca - Testoni Ragazzi to value, systematise, and strengthen their collaboration at both an educational and pedagogical level and at an artistic and theatrical one, to support the cultural citizenship of children and their right to access Art and Culture.

Lo Sguardo Altrove The Festival Observatory

Lo sguardo altrove - Osservatorio del Festival has been part of Visioni since its first edition in 2004, and is now recognised in the "ZeroThreeSix... Theatre" Protocol, shared by La Baracca and the Municipality of Bologna. With educators, teachers, and professionals among its members, the group is coordinated by Marina Manferrari, and for years has been exploring the relationship between art and education.

The group's activities and work develop throughout the year, with a special focus on projects such as On the other side of the glass and A story is about to be born, AMEY over the past few years and Zero/Tre chiama Italia this year, when the group will be accompanying and interacting with the artists in the crèches. Over the years, the group has produced important documentation and publications.

AMEY - Artists Meet Early Years

During the 2022 edition, on Visionifestival.it, the international call for under-35 young artists to take part in Artists Meet Early Years – AMEY will be launched for Visioni 2023.

Started in 2017, AMEY has become one of the cornerstones of Visioni. Then, in 2020, for reasons we are all well aware of, we were forced to put the project aside for a while, as it was (and is) mainly centred on the opportunity for young artists to travel and move freely.

We like to think that the project will make a brand new start in 2023; for this reason, we are launching a call for proposals and hope that we will be able to travel again soon.

AMEY offers young artists the opportunity to experience something useful for the development of their personal research work for children and young children. They are not artists-trainers, but training artists who can count on the high quality of the city's educational services, thanks to the collaboration with Area Educazione (Education Department) of the Municipality of Bologna.

AMEY 2017, 2018, and 2019 are documented in the new publication Visioni di futuro, visioni di teatro "Artists Meet Early Years 2017 / 2018 / 2019", edited by Alessia Cingolani, Anna Paola Corradi, and Marina Manferrari.

THE CLUB/March 2022

Seminar about theatre and very young children

The Club is a "place for futility": there are no goals to achieve or thesis to demonstrate, but it is a place where we can think, tell, and listen... just for the pleasure of it.

Not only were the two previous editions of the Club - held in May and October 2021 - really successful, but they were also a surprise for the richness of the thoughts shared by all the participants.

We hadn't planned it, but what we had hoped for actually happened: the Club became a think-tank with the special task of investigating the topic of Theatre and very young children, boys and girls from 0 to 4 years old. considering its many aspects and analysing it from different points of view, without, however, reaching shared conclusions or common opinions.

Three main themes will be guiding the meetings of The Club:

- The invisibility of children
- What are the new artistic challenges for theatre for the very young?
- How can we make an impact on the social and political context so that more opportunities are given to 0-4 theatre, in terms of both quality and quantity?

In the March 2022 edition of The Club, the participants will be 13 Italian TYA professionals.

ASSEMBLEA ASSITEJ ITALIA

This year, Visioni hosts the general Assembly of Assitej Italy, the Italian branch of the worldwide association uniting theatres as well as cultural and artistic organisations in over 80 Countries, with the aim of promoting the quality and cultural meaning of theatre for children and young people.

It will be an opportunity to exchange and share ideas about the past and present of the Association and its activities, and to start new TYA 14 | processes and projects in Italy and in the world.

Thursday, March 17, 20.30 VALERIA FRABETTI AWARD second edition

The winners of the second edition of the Valeria Frabetti Award will receive the awards during Visioni 2022.

The Award is dedicated to those who, as artists, pedagogues, researchers, politicians, cultural operators, or institutions, have promoted the development and diffusion of performing arts for very young children (0-3 years old) in Bologna and in the world. The Award is a tribute to Valeria: as artistic director of La Baracca, she supported the launch of the project "Theatre and crèches", passionately contributing to its development for over 30 years, as an actress and directress.

The Award aims at:

- promoting the acknowledgement of young children as allaround subjects who are fully able to understand, feel and express themselves as well as their interest in establishing an artistic relationship with artists, other children and adults, teachers, and parents alike.
- recognising the important role of crèches as educational and cultural institutions in supporting the personal and social development of young boys and girls.
- support the cultural citizenship of the youngest of children and their right to access Art and Culture.



Friday, 18 March, 17.00 National Award INFANZIA PICCOLO PLAUTO fifteenth edition

At Visioni 2022, we will be honoured to host the 15th edition of the National Award "Infanzia – Piccolo Plauto".

Supported by the Department of Science of Education "Giovanni Maria Bertin" (University of Bologna), in 2006 the magazine "Infanzia" established the Award "Infanzia – Piccolo Plauto".

The Award is assigned to the best learning and educational experiences selected among the ones published on the magazine over the previous year, or to subjects and entities that have given significant contribution to children's education and culture. Founded in 1973, "Infanzia" is a scientific and professional magazine of the University of Bologna, with a special focus on education in the 0-6 age group. Piccolo Plauto makes his appearance in the first issue: born from the imagination and graphic skills of Marco Dallari, Piccolo Plauto looks at the grown-up world through the eyes of a child, revealing aspects that can only be glimpsed with the "innocence" of a young boy.

Monday, March 14, 14.30 - 17.00

scenic genome - LAB

with **Nicola Galli**, artist and dancer (Ferrara - Italy)

The workshop is based on the original educational method "scenic genome" - freely inspired by genomics research -, and it offers a space for experimenting and exploring body language with exercises involving guided improvisation. We will be "activating" our body by focusing on its main centres, our musculoskeletal balance, and movement, in a playful discovery and exploration of body language and gestures that will help us perceive and become fully aware of our creative potential.

Monday, March 14, 14,30 - 17,00

A workshop in three acts

with **Giada Ciccolini** and **Sara Lanzi**, actresses, La Baracca - Testoni Ragazzi

With this workshop, you will enter the backstage of Cornici, a show by La Baracca that we created starting from black boards and white chalks, as we believe that signs - and their language - complement words and movement. With too many questions and very few answers, our starting point will be the objects we use in the show, but we will tell different stories, exploring all the possibilities of transformation that we have chosen, and also the ones we have turned down.

Tuesday, March 15, 14.30 - 17.00

The singing body

with Layla Raña, directress, Andrés Zará, musician and performer, Alvaro Pizarro, dancer - Compañía Aranwa (Chile) What's the sound of our body? How can our body support and enhance sound? In this workshop, we will try to play with our body and voice to find out how these tools can become more and more powerful and generate sequences starting from the body or the sound: an alliance that will give life to a wonderful dance.

Wednesday, March 16, 14.30 - 17.00

The mask's suitcase

with **Carlo Presotto**, actor and director, La Piccionaia Centro di Produzione Teatrale (Vicenza - Italy)

Playful theatrical experiences to explore our body language through the use of a mask - from commedia dell'arte to costume play.

In this workshop, we will reflect on the role of orality in contemporary society, and we will try to re-conquer verbal expression outside books. In the words of our daily life and experiences, as well as in the words of tales, we can still find important nuances that might disappear in the books we use/read "for a purpose". We will rediscover our ability to trust the words we use: thanks to their endless, imaginative power, they can draw landscapes, feelings, things, and people inside our souls.

In this workshop, we will discover the secrets of fairy stories, from the ones we loved when we were children to completely new ones. By presenting particularly significant plots, fragments and passages, we will try to adopt an approach to oral storytelling that favours a genuine contact with childhood.

The workshop is a possibility for research and experimentation on the potential of voice and gestures, and on the sensibility we need to give life to the atmospheres and characters of fairy stories.

A workshop, inspired by the principles of juxtaposition used by Magritte. In the workshop we will use "visual sums" inspired by the principles of metamorphosis, juxtaposition, paradox, and contrast. A surreal count of shapes, outlines, and associations.

Tesauro and **Luca Bernard**, musicians, International Museum and Library of Music (Bologna - Italy)

For a long time now, La Baracca- Testoni Ragazzi and the International Museum and Library of Music of Bologna have been working together on cultural and training projects, in a synergy of expressive methods that combine music and theatre through the exploration of the potential of our body. Two forms of art that use two different tools - the absence of words and emotional expressiveness - in two different creative ways. Silence, chanting, movement, and the exploration of an intense space-time strictly connected to feelings can intercept the communicative paths of early years.

VISIONI/COMUNI

We have told about "Visioni" in a lot of ways: one of them was to present the Festival as a "public square", a meeting and interaction point for small children and artists, as well as for artists and education professionals. Visioni/Comuni was supposed to be part of the 2020 edition - the Festival that never was: it was going to be a way to expand the "public square" so that Visioni could become a heritage shared with the various municipalities of the Metropolitan Area of Bologna, thanks to the constant commitment of those who work as education and theatre professionals.

The project has survived the pandemic crisis and, in the October 2021 edition, many professionals joined us in our training activities. Now, Visioni/Comuni has finally found its place in the Festival.

Do you remember what sound does it make?

A meeting to present the work carried out between September and October 2021 in five libraries in the city, and concluded in December at Salaborsa Ragazzi, as part of the P.O.L.P.A. project, conceived by Bologna Bilbioteche, starting from nursery rhymes collected by the poet Bruno Tognolini. Through films, listenings and games it will be possible to experience a simple yet profound cultural action based on remembering together using the voice, guided by **Laura Masi** and **Alice Ruggero**. The narration of the process aims at enhancing an idea of collectivity that can be built up through shared experience, and renew with the participants the lively and natural exchange that takes place during the meetings in the library.

THE CHILDREN-SPECTATORS 2022 Exhibition

Now at its fourth edition, the Exhibition is part of the European project Mapping, a map on the aesthetics of performing arts for early years. One of Mapping's goals is to create a high-quality interaction between performing arts and the world of illustration and children's literature. There is a big difference between illustrating moments of theatre, dance or circus, and filtering those moments, those fragments, seeing them through the eyes or the emotions of a child, focusing on the richness of the moments in which a child-spectator captures images, sounds and words that feed their imagination.

The exhibition is created in collaboration with **Bologna Children's Book Fair**, who launched the Call for Proposals 2022, collecting **721** illustrations from artists in **65** Countries.

The contents related to the 4th edition of the exhibition "The Children-Spectators" - including the illustrations selected for the previous editions, the curated exhibition, interviews and presentations - will be available on Visionifestival.it.

Mapping (2018-2023), five years of Visions for Europe. Words, images, sounds and movements intersect to meet the early years audience...

Mapping. A Map on the aesthetics of performing arts for early years A large-scale cooperation project supported by Creative Europe, Culture Sub-Programme.

Mapping is an artistic research project about **the sensory-based relationship with early years - children from 0 to 6 - through performing acts**. It is dedicated to the "children-spectators of today, not only of the future".

Early Years use to experience intense aesthetic moments, which reveal themselves through long silences, wide eyes, imperceptible sounds, sudden excitement, surprise, unexpected laughter, and unusual stances, that display the total involvement of their senses.

Mapping is a process full of **generative questions** that create other questions, useful for starting to "map" the aesthetic dimension of young children, to help us find our way in the sensory-based relationship between small children and artists.
